<u>Sermon Study Guide – October 14th, 2018:</u>

Today's Focus - "God Wants a Church that Stands Forever"

- 1) Thoughts to get you started...
 - As we continue our series, "Church Shopping with God", what types of things stand out at you as you look for/at a church?
 - What kinds of things do people look for in churches, which are fleeting or superficial? How about you? Do you look for a church that "stands forever", or a church for the moment?
- 2) Today's Message: Matthew 16:13-18

¹³ When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" ¹⁴ They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets." ¹⁵ "But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?" ¹⁶ Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

¹⁷ Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. ¹⁸ And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it."

- 5. How does Jesus affect the way we look at, or "do" church? (*hint: focus on what we say about the message, the music, and the motive!*)

4) Taking it Home:

Consider the following as you go about your week:

- In our sermon we talked about how building the church on the "bedrock" of Christ as Savior will affect things like the <u>Message</u> and <u>Music</u> of a church, or our <u>Motives</u> for going to church. How can it affect a few other "M"-things like...
 - ...<u>Membership</u> and participation in a church?
 - ...<u>Ministries</u> that a church will want to offer?
 - ...<u>Money</u>-how we give offerings, or how a church uses them?
